Sorry, chad, that ship sailed. She married last month, around the clock meaning: for 24 hours, no stop. example: I know it's very late, but I feel really bad. Do you know which pharmacy is open all day? call it a day meaning: to finish working on something, the work of a day was completed. example: we have long been working on this without any progress. Let's call him one day and come with new ideas tomorrow. in a blow meaning: immediately, at the same time. example: I went to make commissions and managed to do everything on a hit, not born yesterday meaning: experienced, not naive or easily deceived. example: you can't expect me to believe that the pot broke. I wasn't born yesterday, you were playing ball with the dog in the house again! on the clock of someone meaning: during the time someone is responsible, while someone is on duty. example: mark has a bruise again on the leg. Money to burn: it means having more money than you need. Thanks to the rich husband of her has the money to burn and always shopping in luxury boutiques. Money Parliaments: means that rich people can get what they want. We cannot compete with large companies. The money always speak. On the house: it means something is given to a customer for free. Because they made us wait so long for our table, the drinks were at home. Pay peanuts: it means working for very few money. The work paid the peanuts but had to accept it so you can pay the rent.
