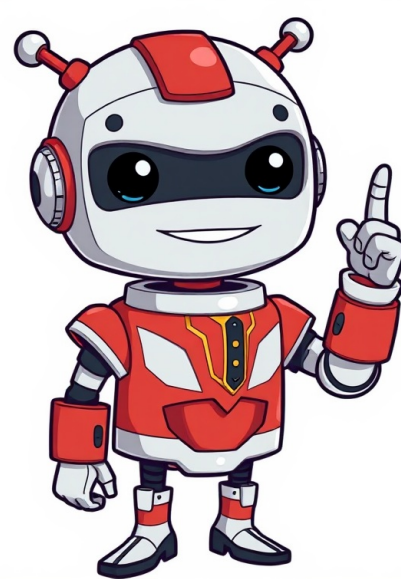

The last piece of Hong Kong to fall under British control was New Territories, purchased on a 99-year lease in 1898. It is now scheduled to return to Chinese ownership in 1997. In 1984, an agreement was made between the British and Chinese that Kowloon and Hong Kong Island would be included in the handover. A popular English language business newspaper is "The Standard". Hong Kong's main commercial district is Central, which was previously referred to as "Victoria". Other areas include Causeway Bay, Admiralty, and Wanchai. Cantonese is the dominant language spoken in Hong Kong, a tonal language first developed in Southern China. A new airport was built on Chep Lap Kok in 1998 after Kai Tak airport reached capacity. The airport opened with a massive logistical move, moving all operations from the old airport to the new one.
