TOEFL tests come in paper-based (PBT) and internet-based (iBT) formats, with iBT being the most prevalent, comprising 97% of all tests. The PBT format assesses listening, reading, and writing skills, while the iBT evaluates all four language skills through a computer-delivered test lasting approximately three to four hours. Scoring networks differ between the two formats, with iBT using computer scores for reading and listening sections and human professionals scoring writing and speaking sections. It's best to check with your desired institution for their score requirements. The costs vary between the iBT and PBT tests, with the iBT costing \$185 and the PBT around \$180. Some countries also charge different exam fees, such as in New York where the average cost is \$235. There are additional fees for late registration, rescheduling, and other services. In contrast, the Duolingo English Test is a convenient and inexpensive option that's accepted by many institutions worldwide. It's a modern test that assesses reading, writing, speaking, and listening skills in an online environment. One of its advantages is that it can be taken from home on a computer, unlike other tests which require testing centers or admission offices. The Duolingo test offers an affordable rate compared to other language proficiency tests, priced at \$49 for a score and interview, significantly lower than competitors like IELTS or TOEFL, which can cost upwards of \$200. The OET (Occupational English Test) is designed specifically for healthcare professionals, assessing their ability to communicate effectively in clinical settings. As the preferred test among healthcare institutions and regulatory boards globally, it covers 12 key careers: nursing, medicine, dentistry, and more. The OET@Home test offers a computerized version of the OET, making it more accessible for some candidates. This test is only available for OET Medicine and Nursing exams, while others must take the paper-based version. The OET@Home test is designed for locations where testing centers are unavailable and allows candidates to take the exam from home using their computer. Despite being computerized, the test format, questions, and duration remain the same as the paper-based version. The OET Medicine exam has a specific format, with a 50-minute listening section, a 45-minute writing section, and a 60-minute reading section. The speaking test lasts 20 minutes and is scored on a scale from A to E. To pass, candidates must score at least 350 in each section or achieve a minimum grade of B for most boards and councils. The OPI (Oral Proficiency Interview) assesses speaking skills via a one-on-one telephone interview, focusing on everyday situations and social interactions. The test results range from Level 1 (low language proficiency) to the highest level indicating advanced proficiency.
